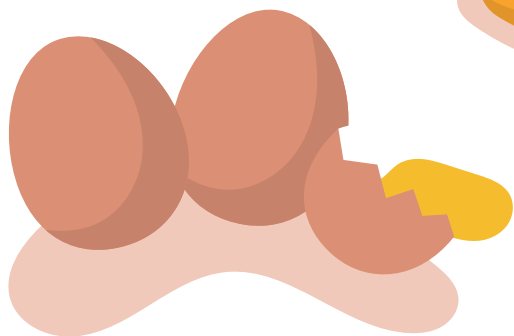

To stay safe when making pancakes always make sure you:

- Have an adult in the kitchen whilst you are cooking.
- Check that there are no overhanging wires, tea towels or oven gloves on the hob or cooker. These can easily catch fire.
- Pay close attention to the pancake whilst you are cooking to make sure it doesn't burn.
- Turn off the hob or cooker and remove the pan from the heat if you need to leave the kitchen for any reason.
- If you see a fire in the kitchen get out of the house and call 999 when you are safe.

It's amazing to think people have been making pancakes for so many years!

2 = a) True

61% of house fires start in the kitchen. Always make sure an adult is with you in the kitchen if you want to cook something.

3 = a) Made in the UK

The pancake made in Rochdale near Manchester actually weighed 3 tonnes, that's the equivalent weight of three cars!

4 = b) Distraction

Stay with your food when cooking to reduce the chances of an accidental fire.

Most people use cooking oil to cook their pancakes. Take care as oil can catch fire very easily. Make sure you clean up any spills before turning on the cooker.
